



Make an Edvard Munch ice cream

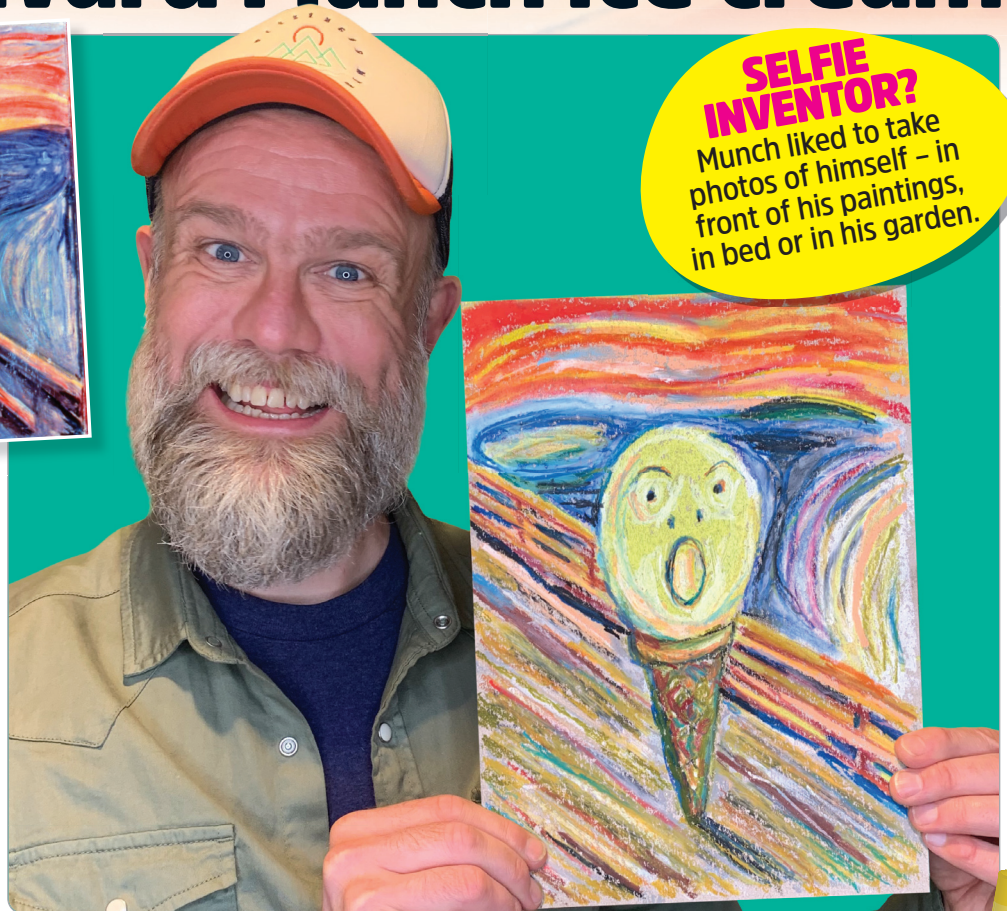
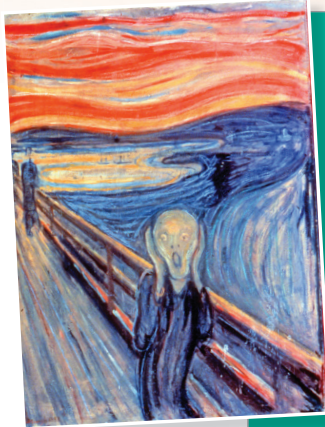
What you need

- A sheet of card or paper
- Oil pastels (or paints/coloured pencils)

Hello, my name's Olaf Falafel. I'm a dad, a stand-up comedian and the author and illustrator of the *Trixie Pickle Art Avenger* books. Every month I show you how to create art inspired by a famous artist. I also share silly jokes, like this: Why do Norwegian ships have barcodes on the sides? So when they arrive in port, they can Scandinavian!

Talking of Norway, this week's artist is Norwegian expressionist painter Edvard Munch. Expressionist art shows feelings rather than what things look like. Munch's most famous work is *The Scream*. It shows a person on a bridge, holding their face and looking really scared or surprised, with a swirling, colourful sky behind them. Munch wanted to show how strong feelings, like fear or anxiety, can feel inside.

I've made my own version of *The Scream* but given it a funny, summer twist by turning it into *The Ice Cream*. Have a go at making your own.



SELFIE INVENTOR?

Munch liked to take photos of himself – in front of his paintings, in bed or in his garden.

1 Use just your yellow, white and orange oil pastels to make an oval-shaped blob in the middle of your card – this is your ice cream.



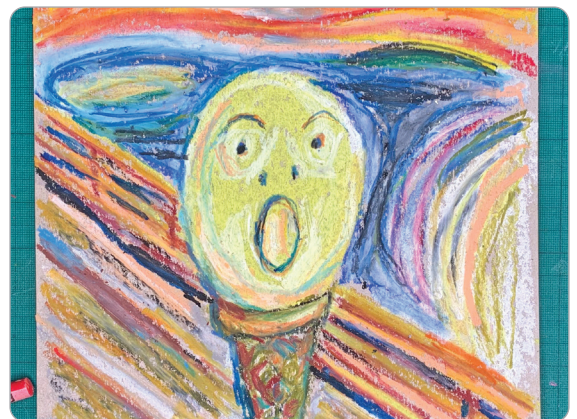
2 Draw a cone underneath using colours that you might not expect to see, such as blues and reds. Behind your ice cream draw a diagonal walkway and railings using lines of colours.



3 Create a swirly background using blues, reds and oranges.



4 Finally, add a screaming face to your ice cream – and your Munch-style summery masterpiece is finished!
