Fool your friends by photographing a fake sighting of an alien spaceship.




Take your frisbee to a clear outdoor space, and throw it in the air. If you don't have a frisbee at home you could make your own alien spaceship out of paper plates.



2 Ask a friend or family member to snap a photo of the frisbee while it's in the air. You might want to try this from different angles. Shaking the camera will create a nice blurred effect.





A black and white photo is sometimes more believable. Now, invent a spooky story behind the UFO sighting, and you're ready to share your picture – but will it fool anyone?

How does it work?

UFOs (Unidentified Flying Objects) or UAPs (Unidentified Aerial Phenomena) are sightings of things in the sky that can't be explained (see page 20). Some are genuine mysteries, while others have been revealed to be hoaxes. A photo of a UFO taken in Belgium in 1990 was seen around the world, but in 2011 one of the people involved said it was just a piece of polystyrene. Some of the most famous UFO pictures ever were taken in Oregon, US, in 1950. The couple who took the pictures, farmer Paul Trent and his wife Evelyn, claimed they were genuine, but it is thought they faked them by hanging a model from overhead wires.
