

Water-bottle sprinkler

REUSE

There's nothing better on a warm summer's day than getting soaked by a sprinkler. Don't have one? Don't worry, we have a solution.

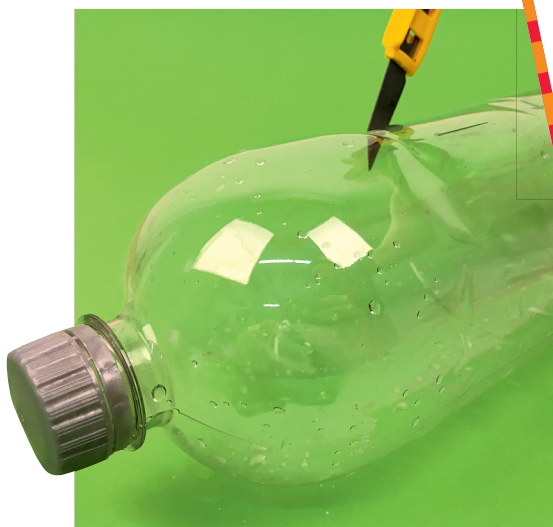
What you need

- Empty two-litre plastic bottle
- Garden hose
- Duct tape
- Scissors or craft knife

WARNING!
Always ask an adult to help when you are using a craft knife.

TOO MANY BOTTLES

About 20,000 plastic bottles are sold worldwide every second.



1 Place your water bottle on the table. Using a craft knife or scissors, make three vertical rows of three slits in the side of the bottle. Make sure you get an adult to help you with this part.



2 Insert the end of a garden hose into the bottle and wrap duct tape tightly around the top of the bottle to hold the hose in place. Make sure no water can escape.



3 Place the bottle in the middle of the garden then turn on the garden hose and watch as your water bottle sprinkler springs to life. You can run through it to cool down or use it to water plants.

Make a bag for life

RECYCLE

Turn a baggy old T-shirt into a bag for life.

What you need

- Old T-shirt
- Sharp scissors
- Bowl
- Pen
- Ruler

DID YOU KNOW?

Manufacturing a paper bag takes four times as much water as making a plastic bag.



1 Take an old T-shirt and cut off the sleeves. Use a bowl to trace around the neckline area and cut an oval shape at the top.



2 Turn the T-shirt inside out and draw a line about 10 centimetres up from the bottom. Make tassels by cutting slits from the bottom of the shirt to the line.



3 Tie opposite pairs of tassels together. Then tie the neighbouring tassels to avoid gaps. Turn your T-shirt back the right way and you have your eco-bag.
